




Goofy Zombie Template

How to Preserve a Pumpkin

The Best Ways to Preserve Pumpkins

When your pumpkin is still uncarved and you wish to preserve it for masterpiece time, you're in luck! Uncarved pumpkins last eight to twelve weeks as long as they were healthy and disease-free when they were picked. If you're unsure, there are a couple things you can do to keep it from rotting as soon as you bring it home. First, wash and dry the pumpkin.

Once your pumpkin is thoroughly dry, you can spray it with a mixture of **one tablespoon of bleach per quart of water**. Make sure that the spray gets into all the edges and any open "cuts" on the pumpkin. This will help get rid of any mold, mildew, and other things that rot your pumpkin quicker.

Alternatively, you can put the pumpkin into a bucket and soak it in the bleach and water mixture for about twenty minutes.

No bleach? No problem! You can also **preserve pumpkins with floor cleaner** by applying a coat of any liquid floor cleaner with a damp cloth. Note that floor cleaner does not preserve carved pumpkins.

Luckily, **gourds are hardy little produce** that won't be hurt by a light frost. However, you should make sure you're not in for an abnormally rough October. If there are too many hard frosts, pumpkins and gourds will turn mushy.





Unfortunately, there's no real surefire way to preserve that pumpkin forever once you've carved it. However, if you follow these eight easy steps, you can give your whole expertly-sculpted pumpkin the longest life possible and keep it as the perfect decoration until Halloween:

- 1. After the pumpkin has been carved, rinse it out with water to get rid of excess strings and gunk.
- 2. Soak the pumpkin in the aforementioned bleach solution (1 tablespoon of bleach per quart of water) for about 20 minutes. You may need to hold it down somehow in case it tries to float. Be sure to wear gloves when you're working with bleach.
- 3. Wipe the pumpkin dry.
- 4. Spray with extra bleach solution.
- 5. Dry the pumpkin upside-down for at least 20 minutes.
- 6. Coat the cut areas from your carving with petroleum jelly.
- 7. Wipe away the excess petroleum jelly from the skin of the pumpkin.
- 8. **Keep the pumpkin inside** where it can be consistently cool and moist.

If you want to preserve your pumpkin without bleach, **you can try vinegar**. Keep in mind, however, that the results won't last as long. To preserve a carved pumpkin with vinegar, add two tablespoons of white vinegar and one teaspoon of lemon juice to a quart of water and use it to replace the bleach solution in the steps above.

At this point, it will last longer in the house, but **it will still do okay outside** – especially as it gets closer to Halloween when you want to start putting it on your porch.

Note that warmer climates like Florida are not conducive to preserving a carved pumpkin for very long, so be aware that your pumpkin's lifespan will be greatly reduced by the constant warm weather.





Real Candles or LED Lights?

Do you prefer to light your jack-o'-lanterns with real candles or LED lights? Some of our favorite bloggers weigh in!

Keepin' It Real

"I love using real tea lights like I did as a child who grew up in a small town. Depending on the size of the pumpkin, I might use 2-3 tea lights. Seeing them flicker on a dark Halloween night makes me happy!" – Kristie Cain from Gold Standard Workshop

"For a 'natural' look I prefer real candles. For example if I want to do a spooky tablescape the night of a party, I might opt for real candles over faux. I also prefer real candles inside real pumpkin, I think they let off a nicer glow, and I'm a little leary of real candles inside plastic or foam because of the fumes." —

"I prefer to use tea lights in our pumpkins! I like the brighter light they cast, and sometimes I will use 2 or 3 to really make them shine!" – **Jo-Anna from <u>A Pretty Life in the Suburbs</u>**

LED Lovers for Life

"I prefer battery lights because you get the glow without the mess of melted wax and charred pumpkin. It also eliminates the need to replace the candle every night." – Michelle Barneck from A Little Tipsy

"I prefer LED Lights in my pumpkins. I love that I can light my pumpkins without having to worry about the wind blowing them out, burning my fingers, or burning my house down!" – McKenzie Guymon from Girl Loves Glam

Pumpkin Seed Recipes

As you "gut" your pumpkin in preparation for carving, be sure to save those seeds! We have two delicious pumpkin seed recipes for you to try, courtesy of Food Network Star <u>Addie Gundry</u>.

Sea Salt Caramel Pumpkin Seed Clusters



Ingredients:

½ cup store-bought caramel sauce (like Smuckers)

- 1 cup dark brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3-4 cups roasted salted pumpkin seeds

Sea salt

Directions:

- 1. Line baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. In a small skillet combine caramel sauce, sugar, and cinnamon. Cook until melted and mixture reaches 310 degrees F.
- 3. Stir in pumpkin seeds until completely coated.
- 4. Spread seeds onto baking sheet and sprinkle with sea salt.

Pumpkin Nut and Berry Brittle



Ingredients:

1 cup butter

1 cup sugar

3 tablespoons water

1 tablespoon light corn syrup

1/3 cup lightly salted and roasted cashews

1/3 cup almond slivers

½ cup roasted pumpkin seeds

1/3 cup dried cranberries

Sea salt

Directions:

- 1. Line baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. In a medium skillet melt butter. Add sugar, water, and corn syrup. Bring to boil and cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, until thermometer reaches 290 degrees F. This will take about 18 minutes. Watch carefully in the last 5 minutes to make sure it does not burn. To test doneness, take a small amount of mixture and drop into very cold water/ See if it separates into threads that are hard but not brittle. That means it is ready!
- 3. Pour mixture on parchment lined baking sheet. Let sit for 2 minutes.
- 4. Sprinkle nuts, seeds, and fruit on top.
